George J. Thurnher, Jr., 76, of Woodbridge, Virginia, died on April 11, 2023, at Walter Reed National Military Medical Center.

A proud New Yorker born in Queens, he was a diehard Yankees and Giants fan. After graduating from Chaminade High School, Mineola, New York, he attended Boston College, Chestnut Hill, Massachusetts. When at BC, he was a member of the Lewis Drill Team, making many lifelong friends. Later, he received a master's degree from Central Michigan University, Mount Pleasant, Michigan.

He retired from the U.S. Army at the rank of Major after a 20-year career as a Military Policeman, with assignments in Korea, Germany, and various U.S. posts. His second career was as a physical security specialist in many locations throughout Northern Virginia and Washington, DC.

He was preceded in death by his parents, the late George J. Thurnher, Sr. and the late Azzie Lee Thurnher.

He is survived by his loving wife of 53 years, Myrna; son, Jeffrey Thurnher (Rachel) of Fayetteville, North Carolina; daughter, Kristin Florin (Carl) of Arlington, Virginia; five grandchildren (Zachary and Ryan Thurnher; and Oscar, Azzie, and Matilda Florin); and brother, Charles Thurnher (Adele) of Manhattan Beach, California. His memory will be cherished by his many

cousins, nieces, and nephews. George's legendary storytelling prowess will be fondly remembered by all who knew him.
