Joseph "Joe" Casey passed away peacefully on December 29, 2025, at the age of 91. He was born in Lawrence, Massachusetts on December 25, 1934.

Joe was driven by his deep devotion to his Catholic faith, love for his family, commitment to his community, and dedication to charity. He lived with purpose and selflessness, and that was evident by his actions and impact on those around him.
