Julian Joseph Kiedrowski, 90 of Lake Ridge, VA, died January 17, 2021, of complications of Covid.

After graduating high school, Julian enlisted in the US Air Force. He served in Korea as a radio operator and flew 78 missions. In 1955, he was stationed in Finley, ND, where he met lone Vosseteig. They were married in 1957. He went on to serve in Vietnam and retired from the Pentagon Reconnaissance Division of the Joint Chiefs of Staff in 1971. He continued to serve our country in various positions within the Federal Government and retired completely in 1995.

He was preceded in death by his parents Joseph and Dominika Kiedrowski, sisters Leonarda and Lucille and brothers Dennis and Adrian.

He is survived by sisters, Irene, Evelyn, Yvonne, Janet and Janice, his wife, lone (64 years), sons Michael and Matthew (Sandie), 3 grandchildren Patrick, Brandon and Carlye and 2 great-granddaughters, Lyla and Iris.

Julian was a member of the St. Matthews Lutheran Church since 2001. He will be laid to rest in a private family service at a later date in the St. Matthews Columbarium.
