June Kay Pauley, 70, of Woodbridge, VA passed away unexpectedly and peacefully on December 4, 2020. June, the youngest daughter of Noah Floyd and Virginia Pearl Pauley, was born on September 11, 1950 in United, West Virginia. She was preceded in death by her parents and two older siblings, Ward Pauley and Lee Pauley.

She is survived by her sister, Joyce Fay Strick; her daughter, Nichole Eun Jin Sterioti; her sons Michael Aaron Pauley and Christopher Shawn Pauley; her granddaughters, Kay and Emilia; and her grandson, Zachary.

Following graduation from George Washington High School in 1968, June enlisted in the United States Air Force as a Communications Center Technician.
