Louis P. Greener passed away on April 19, 2020, after a fall in his home related to Parkinson's Disease. He was the beloved husband of Mary C. "Cathy" (Farrell) Greener.

Lou was born in Providence, RI in 1952 to Louise (Pontarelli) and Lee James Konz. After his parents divorce, he was raised by his paternal grandparents, Cecile (Konz) and John Greener in Springfield, MO. Lou graduated from St. Agnes Regional High School. In 1972, after 2 years at Southwest Missouri University, Lou enlisted in the U.S. Army. He served for 7 years in South Korea, Okinawa, Indianapolis, IN and finally Alexandria, VA. Upon discharge, Lou went to work for the U.S. Postal Service. He served as a Letter Carrier, first in McLean, VA, and then Woodbridge, VA. He retired in 2007.

Lou maintained a love for all things New England throughout his life. He was a life-long fan of the Boston Red Sox. Their winning of the 2004 World Series was a great joy for him. He was also a fan of the New England Patriots, the Boston Celtics and Boston Bruins. Lou was an avid collector of sports memorabilia. He also collected movie star photos and was quite a film historian. Lou was an usher at Our Lady of Angels Catholic Church for many years. Most recently, he was a parishioner of St. Elizabeth Ann Seton Catholic Church.

He is survived by his sisters, Catherine Helmer (George) and their sons, Michael and David; and Gretchen Hendrick (Paul); as well as his brothers David (Betty) Crystal, and Matthew (Khrista) Crystal; his sister-in-law, Lynn (Liller) Farrell, and many nieces and nephews.
