Mary completed public schools in Wicomico County of Salisbury Maryland. Mary later moved to Washington DC. She attended the University of the District of Columbia, earning a Certificate in Cosmetology. Mary had one brother, Mervin Jr. (deceased). Mary met Emmet through her first cousin, Cathleen who was married to Emmett's brother William. Emmett and Mary were married on February 17, 1968 and were happily married for 57 years.

Mary joined the church and accepted Christ at an early age. Mary was active in the Methodist Women of Faith and served as the Spiritual life coordinator for the district. She joyfully served in that position for many years and made many friends. Mary and her husband joined Cokesbury United Methodist Church and were members for over twenty years. Then Mary and Emmet joined St. Paul and have been members for over nine. Mary was a member of the Seekers Sunday School class until her health failed.

Mary worked at the Library of Congress retiring in 1993.

Surviving Mary are her husband, Emmett; preceded in death by her brother, Mervin Williams, Jr. (Evonne), of Salisbury, MD; Brother-in-law Kenneth Wright of Chesapeake, VA (Simonetta); and a host of nieces, nephews, cousins and dear friends.
