Shawn Walters, 50, of Woodbridge VA, passed away at home surrounded by his family on Thursday June 10th after a two-year battle with Pancreatic Cancer. Shawn's mother said, as a boy Shawn was often generous, perceptive, and persuasive.

When he was about 10, I saw him trying to take a loaf of bread out of the house. I asked him what he was going to do with it. He said he met some people down by the river and they didn't have anything to eat. So, he was going to give it to them.

Another time, when he was a boy and recuperating in the hospital from a surgery, I visited him at dinnertime. The nurse brought in his dinner, and I was glad to see him eating. I think I said, "the dinner sure looks good". The next time I went to visit him, the nurse brought in two dinner trays. She said, "Shawn said he wouldn't eat unless his mother got dinner too!"

When I first met my stepson Shawn, he was 13 years old. Right off the bat he was eager to check me out; to see what kind of person I was. Primary on his list was my physical strength. One afternoon while we were all sitting around the kitchen table, he decided to challenge me to an arm-wrestling contest. I immediately took him up on his challenge, and within seconds I won. He was totally surprised and left the room. Nothing else was said.

Over the next couple of weeks I started to notice various dumbbells and weight training supplies laying around the house. Later, I noticed he and his friends in the driveway bench pressing weights. It was soon apparent that Shawn had taken up body building and weight training in a serious manner. A passion, really. Of course, I knew the day would come that he would challenge me again to another arm-wrestling match. And when that day came, he slammed my arm down with the greatest of ease! Totally satisfied with his newfound success, we would repeat the challenge often with the same result.

I always suspected that Shawn took up weight training because I beat him that first time, but I never said anything to him about it until a few months ago when I asked him about it. He vividly remembered. He laughed and explained that when he first laid eyes on me, he saw an easy target, a skinny man with skinny arms, and that he would beat me with ease. He said he was shocked when he lost that first time and decided to work out some more so that would never happen again.

When Shawn was 17, I asked him to join me on a weekend backpacking trip in the high Sierra Nevada Mountains. I was leading a group and asked him to come along. He was so full of energy and excitement. Already into fitness, he carried a 50-pound backpack like it was nothing. Arriving at the camp site, Shawn was quick to assist the other campers set up their tents, start campfires, and help in any way he could. He would have made a fine wilderness guide. We were high in the mountains, camped beside an alpine lake. To get to the highest point on this mountain, one had to scale another 300 feet up a granite peak. Shawn was eager to do this. It looked easy. The next morning we set off to climb it. It took some time, but we did it. He loved it! There was a 360-degree view that was worth the work. You could see forever. The climb down was a whole different story. With no climbing gear, and no climbing experience or training, the two of us slowly and methodically worked our way down steep rock faces. I went first, then talked him down, helping him find the best foot and hand holds. Bit by bit we finally made it back down to camp. Shawn never forgot that trip and talked about it often. I always thought we did some good bonding that day.

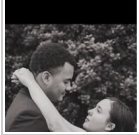

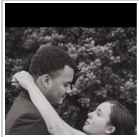
